HOW TO...

Shop second-hand

Whether you want to bag a bargain or be kind to the planet, shop savvy

- If you're shopping for a piece of furniture or larger item, make sure you've taken your measurements beforehand. You'll need to measure the space it's going to fit in, as well as doors or entrances that it will need to pass through. Take a tape measure with you while shopping, so you can make sure your chosen item will fit.
- Make sure you check your piece thoroughly. Often, vintage items won't be immaculate and that's all part of the charm, but you don't want to get home to find that drawers or doors don't open, or that it has woodworm.
- When it comes to car boot sales, be prepared to haggle. If you're picking up a few pieces, why not ask the seller for a deal as you're buying more than one item?
- Think about how you can transform your find. Maybe it's not in the right colour, or you don't like the handles, but these are all factors you could easily change.
- There are some great online vintage homeware stores. Try Oh So Retro, Hutch Community, Mayfly Vintage and selling sites, like Facebook Marketplace.

"This area wasn't the best when we moved in," says Temi. "The original door frame had been left in without a door attached and the floor was covered with a loose piece of carpet. Underneath this was concrete. As a result, we knocked out the old door frame and I decided to tile over the floor. We were lucky enough to have a door with stained glass, though I didn't like the dark red colour of the wood so I painted it the same shade of orange as the living room. The door had to be painted in eggshell paint, which looks a bit lighter than the walls. Although it's slightly ill-fitting and not exactly craft-friendly, I love the door so much. We painted the walls in a vibrant blue. I had the colour made up in B&Q to match the Bert & May floor tiles. I took one of the tiles into the shop and they scanned the colour for me!"
